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1. TEST OF CONTRACT

The shareholders of

Spark44 GmbH Frankfurt am Main,

hereinafter also referred to as the Company, have elected us as auditors for the financial year ending 31. March 2018 at the Shareholders' Meeting on 24. January 2018.

The management then commissioned us to review the annual financial statements and the management report including the accounting for the financial year 2017/2018.

The order was accepted by us enclosing the general order conditions. The signed copy with the consent of the client was received on 08. February 2018.

We confirm gem. § 324 (4a) HGB (Commercial Code), that we complied with the independence requirements in our audit.

We completed this assignment in April 2018 at the Company's offices and subsequently completed the report in our office. It was agreed to provide a comprehensive breakdown and explanation of all items of the annual financial statements (see Annex 7).

The accounting is the responsibility of the management. The report has been prepared in accordance with the principles of proper audit reporting.

Our audit procedures were designed to enable us to make a judgment on the correctness of the accounting records and the compliance of the resulting financial statements and the management report with the statutory provisions and the articles of incorporation. They have been selected according to type and scope, taking into account the meaning of the audit areas and the organization of the accounting. The type, extent and result of the individual test procedures we performed were recorded in our working papers.

The audit procedures did not cover compliance with other legal provisions and the detection of any irregularities. We have not checked the type and appropriateness of the insurance cover in accordance with the order.

The order is based on the "General Conditions of Contract for Auditors and Auditing Companies" attached as Annex 8 in the version of 01. January 2017. Within the scope of the existing contract, we assume liability for our activities towards our client, but excluding liability towards third parties. If a contract-like relationship with third parties should come about as a result of passing on this audit re-

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port, our general terms and conditions of contract also apply in relation to third parties.

2. BASIC FINDINGS

Location of the company

With the following explanations, we accept as auditor's according to § 321 (1) sentence 2 HGB for the assessment of the situation by the management in the annual financial statements and in the management report position. In particular, we will assess the continued existence and future development of the company. Our opinion is based on our own assessment of the position of the company, which we obtained during our audit of the annual financial statements and the management report.

Taking into account depreciation and amortization of $K \in 241$, the book value of fixed assets increased by $K \in 252$. This is due in particular to the fact that prepayments were made on the remodeling measures of the new office space in the amount of $K \in 200$, which were obtained in the financial year.

Liabilities decreased by K€ 871. This is due to the repayment of liabilities to Group companies.

The equity ratio of the company amounts to 34.4% (previous year: 27.4%).

The increase in cash and cash equivalents of $K \in 338$ is attributable to the cash inflow from operating activities in the amount of $K \in 831$ and a cash outflow from investment activities due to the new office space in the amount of $K \in 493$.

In the year under review, revenues increased by 12.6% or K€ 2,476 to K€ 22,187. The cost of purchased services declined by 4.9% or K€ 500. This contrasted with disproportionate increases in personnel expenses of 22.7% or K€ 1,568 and an increase in other operating expenses of K€ 595. A net profit of K€ 699 compared to the previous year of K€ 206 was achieved.

Based on our audit, we conclude that the assessment of the situation and the opportunities and risks of future development by the Company's directors is accurate.

Facts that could endanger the continued existence of the company or that could materially impair its development were not identified during our audit.

3. SUBJECT, NATURE AND SCOPE OF THE TEST

We have audited the accounting, the annual financial statements and the management report in accordance with the provisions of §§ 316 et seq. HGB and prepared the audit report in accordance with the auditing standard PS 450 of the Institute of Public Auditors e. V. (IDW).

We then examined the management report to see whether it complied with the statutory provisions, was consistent with the annual financial statements and the findings of our audit, and gave a true and fair view of the Company's position (§ 317 (2) HGB).

The audit of compliance with other statutory provisions is only one of the tasks of the audit of the financial statements to the extent that this has repercussions on the annual financial statements or the management report. The detection of criminal offenses was not the subject of our examination, neither was the nature and appropriateness of the insurance protection.

The legal representatives of the company are responsible for the accounting and the information given to us. The present annual financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting regulations of the HGB.

Our audit was based on the provisions of German commercial law (§§ 316 et seq. HGB) and the German generally accepted standards for the audit of financial statements promulgated by the "Institut der Wirtschaftsprüfer in Deutschland e. V. (IDW)".

The audit must be conducted in such a manner that any errors or omissions which have a material effect on the presentation of the financial, earnings and assets position as reported in the annual financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and the management report are sufficiently significant Security are recognized (§ 317 (1) sentence 3 HGB).

The effectiveness of the accounting-related internal control system and the evidence supporting the disclosures in the books and records, the annual financial statements and the management report are examined primarily on a test basis within the framework of the audit. The audit includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements and management report.

As part of our risk-oriented audit approach, we have gained an overview of the economic and legal environment of the company. Building on this, we have explored the company's goals and strategies to identify business risks that could lead to material accounting errors. Through discussions with senior management and by reviewing the Company's corporate records, we examined what action

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the Company has taken to address these business risks. In this regard, we have performed an audit of the adequacy of the Company's accounting-related internal control system. This audit focused on the following areas, which are closely related to accounting:

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- Control environment of the company
- Process of business risk analysis by the company management
- Establishment of organizational measures by the management in response to identified business risks
- Accounting system and management information system
- Supervision of the internal control system by the company management.

The audit work on the internal control system has been carried out with great difficulty in the following business areas as well as operational functions:

- Revenues
- Intercompany transactions

In particular, the objective of the audit procedures described above was to identify the business risks that constitute a particular source of material accounting error. We took this knowledge into account when determining our further audit procedure. In those areas where management has set up appropriate internal controls to limit these risks, we have performed functional reviews to ensure that these measures are consistently effective. The degree of effectiveness of these internal controls determined the nature and scope of our audit of individual transactions and holdings, as well as our analytical audit work. In the other areas, we conducted mainly individual case studies on the basis of random sampling and analytical audit procedures.

Based on our assessment of the accounting-related internal control system, we have taken the principles of materiality and cost-effectiveness into account in determining the further audit procedures.

Both analytical and case-by-case reviews have been carried out by type and scope, taking into account the importance of audit areas and the organization of accounting in selected samples.

The samples were selected to reflect the economic importance of each item of the financial statements.

We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

Analytical audit procedures (IDW(Institut of Germany auditors) PS 312) were carried out in the context of prior-year comparisons of individual items in the

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balance sheet and profit and loss account as well as in the analysis of the net assets, financial position and results of operations.

Individual case-by-case examinations were carried out by random sampling (IDW HFA 1/1988).

For the examination of fixed assets there was a computer-aided asset accounting, which was based on the required data on acquisition and production costs (including ancillary costs), normal useful life and selected depreciation.

The order book for inventories is constantly updated.

The stock of debtors has been verified by a debit balance list.

For the verification of bank balances, we received balance confirmations from the credit institute.

We have obtained an opinion from the legal representative of the company, axis Rechtsanwälte GmbH, Cologne, for existing and potential litigation risks as well as the costs of their implementation.

The stock of vendors is shown by a vendor balances list. In April 2018, 21 balance confirmations were sent. Of these, 21 balance confirmations were received during the audit period. Deviations could be clarified.

The previous year's financial statements as at 31.03.2017 were issued with an unqualified audit opinion by us dated 23.06.2017. At the shareholders' meeting on 17.07.2017, the pre-annual financial statements were approved.

The management and the employees of the company have provided all the information and evidence requested by us. The completeness of the provided documents was confirmed to us in a written declaration of completeness.

After that

- all accounting-related business transactions are included in the books and all items and accruals and deferrals are included in the annual financial statements as at 31.03.2018,
- all risks are sufficiently taken into account,
- there were no further contingent liabilities and other financial obligations as they appear from the balance sheet or the notes,

- no special circumstances are identified which jeopardize the existence or continuation of the audited entity or significantly affect its development, and
- provides the financial statements in accordance with the principles of proper accounting a true and fair view of the net assets, financial position and results of operations.

4. STATEMENTS AND EXPLANATIONS OF ACCOUNTING

4.1. Regularity of accounting

Our audit showed the formal and material regularity of the bookkeeping and the other audited documents in accordance with the statutory provisions and the supplementary provisions of the articles of association.

4.1.1 Accounting and other audited documents

The balance sheet of the company as at 31. March 2018 is based on the presentations of the balance sheet as at 31. March 2017 and was developed using the traffic figures of the accounting department as well as making the requisite rebooking and closing entries.

When examining the accounting-related internal control system, we did not detect any weaknesses that resulted in an expansion of our audit procedures or changes in our audit priorities. In our opinion, the process-integrated and downstream controls in the audited areas, both individually and in their interaction, are capable of preventing material financial losses and ensuring the regularity of accounting in all areas.

The accounting-related Internal Control System (ICS) set up by the Company provides for appropriate arrangements for the organization and control of work processes. The accounting procedures have not undergone any significant organizational changes during the reporting period.

The chart of accounts is clearly and clearly structured. Formal orderliness and factual correctness are given. The document tray is clearly arranged and allows a constant access to the individual items.

The accounting is formally and materially duly. We were convinced by the security of the accounting-relevant data and IT systems in the course of several years of audit planning.

The composition of the fixed assets was established on the basis of a company-

led, computer-aided investment index. From this, the plant mirror (see Annex 3, Sheet 3) was developed.

Stock inventories are permanently recorded and evaluated using the Workamajig software system.

Claims against customers are recorded in personal debtor lists that are created using the Workamajig software system.

Intercompany receivables and payables were reconciled with the respective corresponding positions of these companies.

Liabilities to suppliers are recorded in personal accounts payable, which are also created using the Workamajig software system.

Bank deposits are confirmed by balance confirmations.

Other assets and liabilities as well as provisions are recorded in inventories by balance sheets and other records or by the relevant general ledger accounts.

The data of the personnel accounting are contained in a personnel master record list, which is created computer-technically using the software "DATEV Lodas" and constantly updated.

The company prepares plan calculations. In addition, a bill is prepared on the basis of planned costs. These budget bills are regularly agreed with the actual results. Occurring deviations are examined in detail.

4.1.2. Financial Statements

The assets, liabilities and items of the profit and loss account are duly derived from the books and other audited records.

Intangible assets and depreciable property, plant and equipment are carried at acquisition or production cost, less scheduled depreciation. For intangible assets, a useful life of between 3 and 5 years is used. Property, plant and equipment are depreciated over periods of 5 to 15 years.

Inventories are valued at acquisition cost. So far as required, an approach with the lower fair value pursuant to § 253 (4) sentence 2 HGB is applied.

The receivables and other assets are stated at the nominal amount.

Foreign currency receivables are valued at the middle spot rate on the balance sheet date.

The provisions take into account all identifiable risks and uncertain obligations in the amount of the expected utilization.

The liabilities are stated at the settlement amount.

Liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are valued at the middle spot rate on the balance sheet date.

The information provided by the Company in the appendix is correct. The safe-guard clause of § 286 HGB was rightly claimed.

4.2. Overall statement of financial statements

The annual financial statements of Spark44 GmbH give a true and fair view of the net assets, financial position and results of operations in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

A. GENERAL INFORMATION ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The annual financial statements for the financial year from 1. April 2017 to 31. March 2018 were prepared in accordance with the accounting regulations of the German Commercial Code (HGB) for medium-sized corporations in the meaning of § 267 (2) HGB. The size-dependent easements of the HGB were used. The profit and loss account is divided according to the total cost method.

The annual financial statements give a true and fair view of the net assets, financial position and results of operations (§ 242 (2) HGB).

For the financial year, the company fulfills the criteria for a medium-sized corporation in accordance with § 267 (2) HGB.

The registered office of the company is Frankfurt / Main. It is registered with the register court in Frankfurt under number HRB 90999.

In the fiscal year from 1 April 2017 to 31 March 2018, the same principles for measuring revenue as in the previous year are applied in accordance with BilRUG (Accounts Directive Implementation Act). A comparison within the meaning of the BilRUG with the previous year's figures is therefore possible for the first time.

B. ACCOUNTING AND VALUATION METHODS

1. Intangible assets

Acquired intangible assets were carried at acquisition cost and, if they were subject to wear and tear, reduced by scheduled depreciation.

2. Tangible assets

Property, plant and equipment was recognized at acquisition or production cost and, to the extent that it could be worn away, reduced by scheduled depreciation.

Scheduled depreciation was carried out on a straight-line basis over the probable useful life of the assets.

6. provisions

7. liabilities

Liabilities were stated at the settlement amount.

8. Currency Translation

The annual financial statements include foreign currency denominated assets, which in accordance with Art. § 256a HGB be converted into EUR.

Receivables and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are valued at the middle spot rate on the balance sheet date.

9. Prepaid expenses

Deferred items were formed in accordance with the provisions of § 250 HGB.

C. INFORMATION ON THE BALANCE SHEET

The amount of other assets with a residual term of more than one year amounts to K€ 262 (previous year: K€ 273) and relates to rental deposits.

The receivables from affiliated companies include financial receivables in the amount of K€ 130 (previous year: K€ 551) and other trade receivables.

The other provisions essentially consist of

- a provision for bonus and severance payments and other personnel costs in the amount of K€ 516 (previous year:K € 440),
- a vacation provision amounting to K€ 236 (previous year: K€ 119),
- a provision for rental expenses of € 334 k (previous year: € 19 k),
- a provision for outstanding invoices in the amount of K€ 318 (previous year: K€ 235) and
- A provision for services still to be provided K€ 522 (€ 0).

Liabilities to affiliated companies concern trade in goods and services.

Other liabilities have a residual term of up to one year in the amount of K€ 240 (previous year: K€ 194).

D. INFORMATION ON THE PROFIT AND LOSS ACCOUNT

In the marketing year from 01. April 2017 to 31.03.2018 the company was granted a rental-free period by the landlord (third party). When preparing the annual financial statements, it was assumed that the associated costs of the landlord were included in the rental prices after completion of the rent-free period. For this reason, the total rental expenses were distributed over the term of the contract, including the rent-free period, in accordance with the contractually agreed lease term and included pro rata in the current financial year in the provisions for rent (see Notes to the balance sheet). The expense resulting from this provision amounted to T € 320 as of the balance sheet date.

E. OTHER INFORMATION

Other financial obligations

Management Report of Spark44 GmbH for the financial year from 01.04.2017 as of 31.03.2018

1. Fundamentals of the company / business model

Spark44 GmbH offers not only classic advertising for its customers, but also beyond advertising, marketing and consulting services, such as: For example, the development of brand strategies and concepts for digital platforms. The special strength of our company is the integration of classic and so-called "new media." Our customers, Jaguar & Land Rover, are already being looked after 360 degrees, which increasingly includes customer loyalty programs and trading activities.

The company is part of the Spark44 Group, based in London, and avails itself of this service, such as: For example, in the areas of controlling and IT services. As a result, Spark44 GmbH is involved in the administrative processes and the internal control system of the Group.

2. Economic development

The German economy is in a very good condition.

Gross domestic product rose by 2.2% in real terms in 2017 after adjusting for inflation. In 2018, an increase in price-adjusted gross domestic product of 2.4% is expected. The increase in the growth rate is mainly due to the good bin economy compared to the previous year.

The number of employed persons was 44.3 million in 2017. In 2018, a rise of 631,000. additional employed persons. The unemployment rate is currently stable at around 5.7%, the lowest level compared to the last 25 years.

The state budget achieved a surplus of 1.2% of nominal gross domestic product in 2017. This positive fiscal position allows public budgets to carry out more consumption and investment.

The tendencies towards protectionist tendencies in the global economy dampen expectations of higher export growth. Companies expect exports to increase slowly in 2018, enabling or necessitating investments to offset slightly above-average capacity utilization in the industry. But also, the topic "diesel" and a possible ban on driving keeps the economy in suspense.

3. Business development and situation of the company

3.1 earnings

In the financial year 2017/2018, Spark44 GmbH mainly supported the customers Jaguar and Land Rover.

As a result of higher project income, the 2017/2018 financial year developed positively in terms of sales. Revenues increased by K€ 2,170 compared to the previous year to K€ 21,902.

In contrast, the services purchased fell by K€ 317. Personnel costs increased by K€ 1,568 and other operating expenses by K€ 230. This is mainly due to additional rental costs and new business costs. The net profit for the financial year 2017/2018 thus amounts to K€ 699 and increased by approximately 241% or K€ 494 compared to 2016/2017.

In the financial year 2017/2018, the average number of employees is 117. Of this, 103 correspond to the employee concept of § 267 HGB on an annual average, compared with 89 employees in the previous year.

3.2 financial

The financial position is stable. Financial management is designed to settle liabilities within the payment period. For larger orders, the customer requests down payments.

Liabilities to banks do not exist. Liabilities to Spark44 JV amounted to K€ 12.5. No distribution was made in the past financial year.

At € 811 thousand, cash and cash equivalents at the balance sheet date exceeded the previous year's level, which is largely due to the good operating result and ongoing and timely settlement. The liquidity of the company was ensured at all times during the 2017/2018 financial year.

3.3 asset position

The balance sheet total of Spark44 GmbH at the end of the reporting year was K€ 5,423 compared to the previous year at K€ 4,315.

The fixed assets amount to K€ 1,149 and increase in comparison to the previous year with K€ 896. The reason for this is investments in the new office.

Inventories include on-account invoices for work in progress. As in the previous year, these were settled as much as possible in 2017/2018, which was again successful this year and led to a decrease in work in progress of K€ 183.5 compared to the previous year.

Receivables from sister companies fell from K€ 634 to K€ 211. These are receivables from the settlement or financing of larger projects.

The equity ratio is 34.4% compared to 27.4% in the previous year. Above all, the liabilities to Spark44 JV, with which a company relationship exists, fell from K€ 410 to K€ 12.5 in the previous year. The trade payables decreased by K€ 119.2. Other liabilities increased by K€ 36 compared to the previous year.

4. Risk and Opportunity Report

Entrepreneurial activity results in a variety of risks and opportunities in all areas of business. Our risk management system aims to identify risks and opportunities at an early stage so that risks can be limited and opportunities can be seized. A central component of the risk management system is a detailed, monthly rolling planning and controlling system, which is implemented in all companies and subject to regular monitoring by the managing directors of the respective agencies as well as centrally by the Executive Board. The following is a description of the material potential risks and opportunities of the future development of Spark44 GmbH as well as its net assets, financial position and results of operations.

4.1 Industry Risk

Communication in society is always subject to its norms. In this respect, our industry and its output has long been under surveillance by state departments at both federal and, above all, Europe level. This started many years ago in the advertising of tobacco and alcoholic beverages and continued with food and pharmaceuticals. For the automotive and toy industry further legislative interventions in the freedom of communication measures are to be expected. This is also shown by the recent exhaust problems of various manufacturers and the discussion about diesel driving bans in European markets, whose medium and longterm implications are not yet clear. As a professional service provider, we see ourselves as obliged and able to respond proactively and innovatively to these requirements with regard to our communication and to advise our customers well on the associated challenges. However, the associated extensive testing and labeling requirements mean considerable problems for our industry. The concern for consumer protection also has adverse consequences for the competitive structure. The reduced planning security is also one of the causes that leads to agencies to further increased production costs, since temporarilyrequired personnel can no longer be kept economically and z. T. short-term and then at prices must be provided, which not only significantly above those for permanent staff, but z. T. are also above the proceeds. The Spark44s are meeting these challenges with new technical platforms to facilitate better job-sharing with customers and improved capacity management.

4.2 Risk from the departure of key personnel

The turnover rates of our industry are traditionally high, and the agency business has long been characterized by a high willingness of employees to switch employees. In an industry in which careers, as with other partner-managed professional service providers, are ultimately shaped by an up-or-out path, such developments are fundamentally unavoidable. Overall, the market is characterized by new sectors with similar requirements, which, due to their better margins or investors, are also more attractive. T. pay higher salaries, such. For example, some startups, developers of apps or online games, have been made more difficult for some of our profiles. In addition, the general demographic development in our core markets is running against these locations in the medium term and it is a general problem to find sufficiently qualified personnel.

Thanks to our sustainable human resources policy and the breadth of our leadership at virtually every level, we have always succeeded in coping well with the resulting changes and in retaining the right people with interesting tasks or in innovative constellations.

With the recent additions to the portfolio, we at Spark44 GmbH still believe that we are on the right path to long-term success of the company and see ourselves well prepared for the future, both in terms of continuity and continued development.

4.3 Risk arising from the change in technology and the media environment

The variety of communication channels is increasing unabated. At the same time, our concepts can be separated less and less from traditional patterns such as online and offline. This development will continue and we see in the growing communication formats, especially in the area of mobile applications, not just a risk for Spark44, but above all an important opportunity for Spark44 GmbH. At the same time, we are confident that we will be at the cutting edge in terms of creative performance in this segment and that we will be able to expand our share of our total sales as in previous years. However, new forms of communication and technologies, in particular the expanding data-based customer management (CRM), will continue to require our full attention in the Group in the search for qualified personnel and in the market for a shortage of talent in terms of such skills. Additional attention and active action will also be required under the new General Data Protection Regulation (DSGVO), which will come into effect in May 2018 and covers many aspects of our business. The company takes appropriate measures to map these requirements in terms of time, legal and technical-organizational aspects and to implement them productively.

4.4 Risk from the loss of the main customer

The company operates its business mainly from the care of customers Jaguar and Land Rover. Cutting these clients' marketing budgets has a direct impact on the company's business. In order to minimize these risks, the company has set internal targets for the development of new sources of revenue and made significant investments in tapping the markets or customers associated with them. In the current financial year, these investments amount to K€ 347 and K€ 256 in the previous year.

5. Outlook

The economic development 2018/2019 in Germany is estimated to be comparable to 2017. Based on the overall performance, Spark44 GmbH expects overall growth of around 11% compared to the past financial year, of which sales within the group of companies in 2018/2019 will probably increase by approx. 28%. The increase in sales from the corporate group is due to the additional budgets and tasks that are supervised by the German entity.

Personnel expenses in 2018/2019 will increase by approx. 10% compared to the 2017/2018 financial year. The annual result for 2018/2019 will be at a higher level than in 2017/2018 due to increased sales. It is planned with a DB I margin of about 11%.
